A new legal base



- EGTC as European tool -> role on European level & general context of CBC
- Evolving regulation -> Perspectives of further development
- Proactive action

1988: Declaration of Wissembourg
(-> INFOBEST PAMINA, ARGE PAMINA)

2003: Cross-Border Local Grouping
(Karlsruhe Treaty from 1996) Regio PAMINA

2017: European Grouping for Territorial Cooperation
(European EGTC Regulation, 2nd edition from 2013)

- Media interest

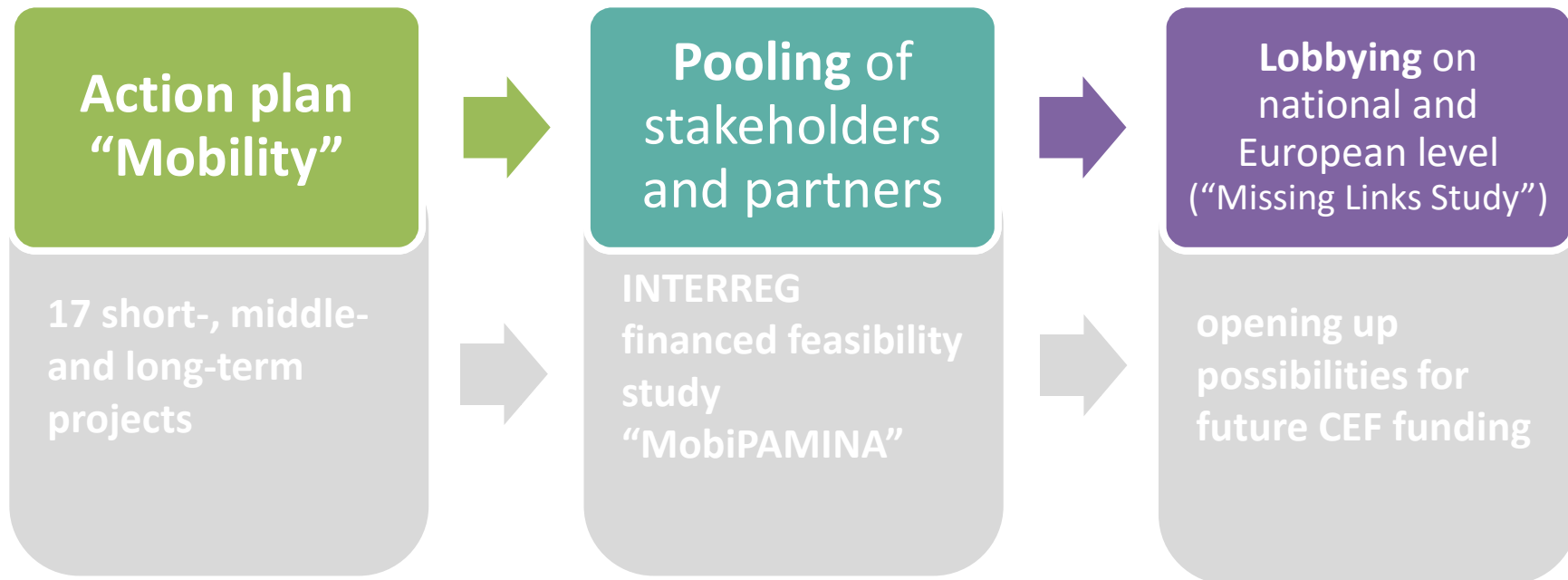
“Hard” effects
